A MESSAGE FROM PAUL

VICAR AT ST PETER AND ST PAUL'S CHURCH,

WATER ORTON

Happy New Year!

I am writing this in December having put out an appeal for food and toiletries. Already there has been a significant response to my appeal. All this food will go to Ukraine to support those defending their nation. Thank you to everyone who has donated food.

Having celebrated the twelve days of Christmas, we move into the season of Epiphany (commencing on the 6th January). Most readers will have heard of the visit of the wise men, often depicted as being in a stable. In reality Jesus was probably about two years old when they visited and was then living in a house. The Gospel of Matthew records their visit (Matthew 2 : 11), *'On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.'* In this visit we get the sense that Jesus (a Jewish man) has come not just for the Jews but for the gentiles as well.

Back in the Autumn we started a monthly afternoon service on the first Sunday of each month. Our next afternoon service of Holy Communion will be at 3.00p.m. on the 4th January, followed by refreshments. On the 11th January we will hold our monthly family service at the Link. The doors will open at 3.30p.m. During this time there will be creative activities, a short bible-based talk and a light supper served. This service is particularly suitable for families with children at primary school.

As many know we have our main services at 9.00a.m. and 11.00a.m. each Sunday. The service at 9.00a.m. is traditional and the worship supported by a choir. At 11.00a.m. we have a contemporary service; there the worship is supported by a music group. As a church we believe in a God who heals today and a good number of us have seen and experienced this for ourselves. On the 18th January we will offer prayer for healing during and after our services. Please join us if you would like prayer.

LIVE A LITTLE

The older generation will hopefully have happy memories of growing up, Hop Scotch and skipping with friends, Jackstones, Marbles and Happy Family card games; Tig and Hide and Seek, often in the street or the local park. Brownies and Girl Guides with exciting adventures camping out in the Welsh Hills. Tennis Clubs and Drama Groups, Sunday School outings to Weston Super Mare and riotous fun at Youth Club.

The common factor is that all these activities were undertaken with friends; often outside and often involving exercise. How different children growing up in 2025 find their world, where screens and mobile phones seem to dominate every area of life. Recent studies by Doctor J F Cross, a Paediatrician, suggests, "Too much screen time affects behaviour, cognitive performance in school and interferes with learning. Excessive screen time is linked to obesity, which can affect self esteem and lead to social isolation". She suggests "Limiting screen time, encouraging physical activity, keeping mealtimes and bed times screen free".

Having worked with children all my life, specialising in finding out, "Why Children Fail", I'm haunted by the prospect of generations growing up without the opportunity to have fun with friends, revelling in being outdoors and responding to the challenges offered by sports clubs, learning how to give and take, win and lose and all in the context of friends and inspirational leaders.

Our village has lots to offer in the way of clubs; Cricket and Tennis, a Youth Club and Young Vocals if one likes to sing. Opportunities to learn a skill, explore the outdoors, to go on adventure weekends offered by our local Beavers and Boys' and Girls' Brigade; both groups meet in our village and welcome new recruits.

We love our children and want the very best for them. Help them take time out from screens and "Live a Little."
